'Less government, more governance'

The maiden budget of the NDA reflects the present government's ideology of "Less Government, More Governance". Focus on fiscal consolidation and the planned reduction of fiscal deficit to 3% of GDP by 2016-17 and the setting up of the Expenditure Management Commission and focused expenditure on social sectors are positive steps to revive the economy. The Budget has erased many grey areas by rationalizing tax and duty structures, which in the past used to lead to unwarranted litigation and discretion. The focus on infrastructure sector and efforts to improve productivity of indigenous coal assets and power plants are noteworthy. The extension of investment allowance under Section 80 IA coupled with tax holiday for 10 years for power sector, for generation as well as transmission, will accelerate in-

vestment in the sector. The major change of allowing RE Investments Trusts and Infra Investment Trusts will provide a big fillip to the sector. The relaxation in SLR and CRR for funding infra projects too is a step towards kick-starting and catalyzing investment in the infrastructure sector. The identification of 16 locations for developing high productivity ports, coupled with improved connectivity of ports by railway through the PPP route and the revival of SEZs and exports, will help improve the competitiveness of our manufacturing sector and will generate employment. The focus on creating productive assets through MNREGA and emphasis on agricultural sector related employment through NREGA too are indicative of the government's intent of productive and focused utilization of funds.

Med intake ends at 83.57, up 6 marks from last year

Ahmedabad: The admission into the medical courses ended at about six marks higher as compared to the last year. The admission ended at 83.57 merit marks.

In the most sought after BJ Medical College, the admissions ended at 95.13 merit marks, which was 91.33 merit marks in 2013.

Dr Jignesh Chauhan, member secretary of the Admission Committee for Medical and Paramedical Courses, said that the last admission into medical was at Adani Medical College in Bhuj. According to Chauhan, the admission in Bhuj Medical College had ended at 75.57 merit marks.

This was expected as this year it was a record high merit in medical and para-medical courses. Ever since Gujarat Common Entrance Test was introduced in 2008, this year has seen high scores. The admission committee officials said that it was expected that the cut off in the medical colleges would increase by six to seven marks in the admission closure.

Chauhan said that this year the score of students in Gujarat Common Entrance Test and the class XII examination was high and as a result, the merit was also relatively high as compared to the last year.

The admission committee had taken up admission for 2,456 medical and dental colleges. In the dental, the admission was taken up for government medical colleges only. The admission for 900 self-financed colleges will be taken up later.

4,000 aspirants not in merit list

Ahmedabad: The ACPC on Saturday declared the merit list of 49,511 students against the seat availability of 27,745. Officials said about 4,000 students were not included in the merit list as their marks were not traceable by the ACPC. The board has asked these students to approach the various helpline centres across the state and submit photocopies of the marksheets. The ACPC will then enter these marks and they would be included in the final merit list. Also, the officials said that these are those students who have not cleared their examination in the first trial and hence their marks were not reflecting in the system.

These seats in Schedule Caste quota were vacant in Surat Medical College, Karamsad Medical College and in Jamnagar Medical College. There were eight seats vacant in NHL Medical College Ahmedabad (one seats) and seven seats in Karamsad Medical College in Socially and Economically Backward Classes.

The committee has announced that the reshuffling for medical and dental will be taken up after 20 July. The committee has said that the admission for dental (self-financed) and other paramedical courses will now be declared. The seats vacant in reserved category, even if they fell vacant after reshuffling, would be converted for open category.

CBSE students cry foul

The students of the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) have cried foul over the merit list prepared by the Admission Committee for Professional Courses (ACPC). They are now planning to challenge it in the Gujarat high court on Monday. K K Gupta, one of the parents, said that 40% of weightage is given to JEE Mains along with 60% weightage to Board's percentile. "However, as per the formula, if a student scores few more marks in board's exam than the other student, he would be able to compensate huge difference of lower marks in JEE main, and even able to get higher rank than the other student," he said.

He claimed that the injustice to CBSE Students is only defective percentile procedure adopted by the Gujarat ACPC. He said that if the calculations given by the Gujarat HC order passed last month had been followed, the CBSE student would have secured 1,091 rank instead of 1,514 rank in the merit list. "The merit list is illegal, unjust, arbitrary, and it should be scrapped immediately and the students will definitely approach the HC against it," he said.

ACPC declared the final merit list of students. Final merit list had 62,723 students against the provisional list of 61,344 students. After the first mock round 9,338 seats were left vacant. The ACPC had allotted 60,529 seats. A total of 34.20 lakh choices were given by 59,000-odd students. Maximum 38,368 students preferred to get admission in mechanical faculty, followed by civil (33,751 students), electrical (30,235 students) and computer (27,146 students).

Vismay has spent a year in jail.

Pharma placements begin

A total of 465 students were interviewed by 18 pharma companies on Saturday, the first day of the two-day centralized placement fair organized by GTU. There are 840 posts in 18 leading companies. Officials said that on Day One, 465 students were present. The package offered was Rs 15,000 to Rs 20,000 a month for MPharm students and Rs 10,000 to Rs 15,000 a month for BPharm students. Of the 465 students who were interviewed, 90 were shortlisted for 110 available posts. About 15 new companies will come on Sunday for selecting students for 730 posts.

Commerce reshuffle from today: The reshuffling for the 9,000 seats in commerce faculty of GU will begin from Sunday. On the last day of fee payment, over 5,500 students did not deposit the fee, which took the number of vacant seats to 9,000.

Jadoo! UFO puzzler for Isro

A curious mail from a popular UFO-buff website, ufosightingsdaily.com, is doing rounds at the Space Applications Centre (SAC) in Ahmedabad. It thanks 'Isro labs' for taking images of a "black pyramid" shaped structure atop an asteroid 1999 RQ36 on June 29 belonging to aliens. A one-minute video on the black pyramid, carrying the 'Isro' watermark, was uploaded on YouTube, by another UFO website, UFOExposed. The UFO website mentions that it was taken by a satellite called NeoSAT. This is a Canadian microsatellite launched by

Isro a few years ago. The mail is being passed off as "utter rubbish" by SAC scientists. This is not the first time SAC has encountered a UFO puzzler. In October 2004, a scientist at SAC was in news when he claimed that during an expedition to the Himalayas to study Samudra Tapu glacier, they had sighted an unidentified object at 14,500 feet—suspected to be a UFO.
