



ART and CRAFT- fun work

(1) Home Sweet Home Photo Gallery


Materials required:

- Shoe-box or one box of similar shape and size
- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Fevicol
- Coins or modeling clay
- Tape
- Photographs of all family members
- Fine-tip permanent marker


Procedure:

- 1. The top of the box (with flaps intact) will be the top of the house.

 Decide what colour you would like your house to be and cover the outside with construction paper. Leave three extra inches of construction paper at the top all the way around where the flaps are present.
- 2. Cut slits in the construction paper at the top corners, so that the paper can fold like the flaps can. Glue the construction paper to the flaps.



- 3. Trim the pictures into rectangular windows or you may decide to cut carefully around the person's picture (sort of a paper doll) and glue that to a rectangular piece of white paper to make a window.
- 4. Decorate the house, placing the windows and a door. You can also include your family name, a message and the year.
- 5. Put coins or the modeling clay at the bottom of the box to give the project some weight and prevent it from falling over.
- 6. Fold corners of the big flaps at the top of the box inwards to make an upside down "V". Fold the corners inward, but leave them sitting like tabs, so that you can glue the roof. Fold the small flaps down inside the box.





7. Decide what colour you would like your roof to be and cut the construction paper to cover it. Glue it on and then add any other details you would like your house to have, i.e., window boxes, shutters, flowers, ivy or anything else you like.

(2) Candle Holder

Materials required:

- Small glass jar
- Glitter glue of different colours
- Oval jewels (flat on back side)
- Fevicol
- Glitter
- Ribbon (optional)



Procedure:

- 1. Put a puddle of glitter glue on the glass jar. Push a jewel into the puddle.
- 2. Repeat using different colours of glitter glue to attach jewels.
- 3. Let them dry.
- 4. Using a paintbrush, brush glue to cover the jar sides from right below the jar threads and around the jewels.
- 5. Sprinkle with glitter. Let them dry.
- 6. Tie ribbon around the jar threads if desired.
- 7. Insert a candle.

(3) Construction Paper Flowers


Materials required:

- Construction paper (of various colours)
- Cotton balls (medium or large and of various colours)
- Plastic straws
- Fevicol
- Scissors

Procedure:

- 1. Draw flowers on the construction paper.
- 2. Cut into the centre of the flower from the side of one of the petals and then cut a small circle out of the middle.
- 3. Overlap the two petals between the cut line and glue together.
- 4. Put some glue on the cotton ball and place in into the centre of the flower.





- 5. Carefully turn the flower over and glue the straw to the back end of the cotton ball.
- 6. Place the flower upside down and lean it against something to allow the glue to dry completely.

(4) Plastic Bottle May Basket

Materials required:

- 20 ounce or 1/2 litre plastic bottle
- Craft knife
- Hole punch
- Narrow ribbon (optional)
- Real flowers or handmade flowers

Procedure:

- 1. Cut the bottle with the craft knife about 4" from the bottom. Discard the top of the bottle.
- 2. Punch holes on two sides directly across each other.
- 3. Insert one end of the ribbon from the outside to the inside. Bring it up and tie a knot.
- 4. Repeat for the other end of the ribbon.
- 5. If desired, punch holes around the top of the bottle. Weave a ribbon in and out through the openings.
