# **BJP hopes to win with political greenhorns**

### 36% Candidates **Never Contested** An Election TIMES NEWS NETWORK

Jaipur: To accomplish its 'Mission-25' of winning all Lok Sabha seats in the state, the BJP is counting on candidates who have never contested any elections.

Out of the 25 candidates field ed in the forthcoming general elections, nine or nearly 36% have never contested even for panchayat or local bodies' elections.

The party has given tickets to popular personalities such as Olympic silver medalist Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore from the Jaipur rural constituency former DGP Harish Meena from

Dausa constituency and Swami Sumedhanand from Sikar constituency, turning down the candidatures of seasoned local leaders.

Other than this, the party has chosen Gajendra Singh Shekhawat from Jodhpur, Rahul Kaswan from Churu, Hari Om Singh Rathore from Rajsamand, Chhotu Ram Chaudhary from Nagaur, Chandra Prakash Joshi from Chittorgarh and PP Chaudhary from Pali for the elections. In the state assembly election

four months ago, the BJP leaded with a good margin in all assembly segments of 23 of the 25 parliamentary constituencies. BJP insiders said this was the reason the party was taking the 'risk' in Lok Sabha elections.

However, the BJP candidates in some constituencies have still not won acceptance from the party workers. For instance, the BJP

workers in Sikar were unhappy about the party's choice of candidate and make no attempts to hide their disappointment. The party

has fielded first timer Sumedhanand, a religious leader who is believed to have a large number of followers in the Jat community.

BJP heavyweight, former MP Subhash Maharia and his supporters have come out against the party decision. Maharia is con-

testing as an Independent against the BJP candidate. Maharia said, 'I have been serving the people of Sikar for the past 18 years. It is unjustified that an outsider should reap the benefits of my toiling. A candidate from Harvana cannot solve the local problems. The par ty has cheated its five lakh devot ed workers in the consistency."

Since the day Sumedhanand's name was announced, the BJF party workers have been protesting against the decision. His car was also attacked recently. Similar incidents were reported from Chittorgarh and other constituencies. "The party had sought names of three potential candidates from its local seniors and workers before picking up its nominee. It is surprising that a candidate without any political experience was still selected for the task to represent the area," a BJP worker said.

### Parties play caste card in Nagaur, Sikar & Dausa

Jaipur: Nagaur, Sikar and Dausa will witness a triangular fight but with a twist since candidates of the same caste are in the fray Since, other caste voters would be a deciding factor in such constituencies, the candidates are leaving no stone unturned in wooing them

Counting number of Meena, Jat, minority and other community votes of a particular constituency is a known method to give tickets to candidates.

In Dausa, Congress candidate Namo Narain Meena, BJP candidate Harish Meena and NPP candidate Kirori Lal Meena are in the fray. While in Nagaur, political parties fielded Jat candidates. Congress candidate Jvoti Mirdha, BJP candidate CR Chaudhary and Independent Hanuman Beniwal will take on each other. In Sikar, Jat candidates including Pratap Singh Jat from Congress, Sumedhanand Saraswati from BJP and Independent Subhash Meharia would compete for the seat

Manish Kumar, an election watcher in

Dausa, said, "The candidates are coming to our area and they are talking about development. They promised us that they will work for the development of the area. Here, the top candidates belong to same caste so we have no other option than to vote for one of them.

Since all the top contenders in Dausa be long to Meena community, Independent candidate Anju Dhanja is trying to cash in on the opportunity to secure votes of other castes when three bigwig Meena leaders are up against each other.

However, Nagaur is another such constitu uency, which has candidates of same caste contesting polls. Jats are in a dominating position in Nagaur but since three Jat candi dates are in the fray, there is always a possibil ity of division of votes, which makes other caste votes a deciding factor.

An election watcher in Nagaur, Ashfaq Kavamkhani, said, "In Nagaur, since 1967 onlv Jats have been becoming MPs from the district. In 1998, BJP fielded Shyam Sunder Kabra, a non-Jat candidate but he lost. So. political parties always prefer to field Jat candidates from here.

### The tale of two arch rivals

Chief minister Vasundhara Raje and her predecessor Ashok Gehlot have captained BJP and Congress for almost two decades now. The two leaders have been chief ministers twice. While Raje's political career has probably reached a crescendo, the one of Gehlot seems to have sunk to its ebb. TOI peeks into the current stature of the two leaders in electoral politics and their status in their respective parties:

### VASUNDHARA RAJE

he has emerged as one of the most prominent regional satraps of BJP. Her clout within the party has soared to the extent that denial of ticket to veteran leader Jaswant Singh from Barmer-Jaisalmer Lok Sab-

firm no to Meena leader. Within BJP, Ghanshyam Tiwari, Devi Singh Bhati, Narpat Singh Rajvi are a few other names, who have been pushed to the wall. The threesome had at some point of time fumed at Raje. A senior Brahmin community leader Tiwari is only an

MLA at present and was not given ticket from Jaipur although he was the party candidate in 2009 Lok Sabha polls. Bhati lost the recent assembly polls and Rajvi was

not inducted into the state ministry although he is sonin-law of late Bhairon Singh Shekhawat.

Raje's son Dushyant Singh is the only one among BJP candidates from Rajasthan, who has been Lok Sabha MP twice. If he wins, he will be the senior most among the LS MPs from the state. The party's central leadership has embraced her as a champion leader

e could not manage ticket for his own son Vaibhav Gehlot for the Lok Sabha polls. Gehlot expressed his discontent about denial of ticket to his son recently at Jodhpur. He went on to say, "Vaibhav ne bhi party ke liye laathi khai hai." Vaibhav had tried for Jalore or Tonk-Sawai

Madhopur LS constituencies. None of Gehlot lovalists has made it to the Congress list of

candidates from Rajasthan. Sitting MPs Mahadev Singh Khandela (Sikar) and Badri Jhakhar (Pali) are a few of

ty's election ticket. But the candidate chosen, Sonaram Chaudhary, is someone who lost even the assembly election by a margin of 14,000 just 3 months back.'

"Since its Jan Sangh times, the Rajput leaders have been winning seats on the same ideology. Our leader late Bhairon Singh Shekhawat played a crucial role in establishing BJP in Rajasthan. Still, just three of our candidates have been nominated in these elections, while a community (Jats) that was never with it has been given seven tickets," Sarvadi noted.
