




### **Positive thinking does matter in life -The best is yet to be**

What can you do to increase positive thoughts and take advantage of the same in your life? Well, anything that sparks feelings of joy, contentment, and love will do the trick. You probably know what things work well for you; maybe it's playing the guitar, maybe it's spending time with a certain person, maybe it's carving tiny wooden pieces. That being said, here are three ideas for you to consider to ...

1. Meditation- Many researches revealed that people who meditate daily display more positive emotions than those who do not. As expected, people who meditate also build valuable long-term skills. For example, three months after the experiment was over, the people who meditated daily continued to display increased mindfulness, purpose in life, social support, and decrease in the symptoms of an illness. Note: If you're looking for an easy way to start meditation, here is a 10-minute guided meditation. Just close your eyes, breathe, and follow along.

2. Writing — A study has been published in the “Journal of Research in Personality”, wherein they examined a group of 90 undergraduate students who were split into two groups. The first group wrote about an intensely positive experience each day for three consecutive days. The second group wrote about a control topic. Three months later, the students who wrote about positive experiences had better mood levels, fewer visits to the health center, and experienced fewer illnesses. This practice of writing positive thoughts or your dreams can be done before you go to sleep or post waking up. This helps you to be better organised than before and also to chase and live your dreams. Note: This blew me away. Better health after just three days of writing about positive things! I used this method of writing and experienced how we can stick to any goal in a more consistent manner.

3. Play — Let us focus on physical activities by scheduling time to play in your life. We schedule events, subjects to study, weekly plans, school timings and other responsibilities into our daily calendars ... why not make some time to play?

When was the last time you blocked out an hour on your calendar just to explore and experiment? When was the last time you intentionally carved out time to have fun?

Give yourself permission to smile and enjoy the benefits of positive emotion. Schedule time for play and adventure so that you can experience contentment and joy, and explore and build new skills. Life is amazing!



The arts, a subject-group that is often side-lined in favour of the more 'serious' Sciences, followed by Commerce. Perhaps we as a society have not fully appreciated the value and role the arts can play, even when it comes to the learning and understanding of traditional subjects. Especially in our schooling system, if only we integrate the arts into the academic curriculum in a manner where they become a regular teaching method, we will see immense benefits in the degree of receptiveness in learners.

First I learned that art has its own language, which opens up a new world to students. The art integration projects added to my knowledge base and made me even more excited about integrating the arts into my curriculum. I can also say that I learned even more than I anticipated.

I never forgot the feeling of watching kids loving to learn, so despite some structural obstacles the arts have always remained a part of my classroom. As rigor became a key factor in the Common Core subjects, I also learnt how to increase academic rigor in the arts and push lessons past simply drawing pictures.

Teaching academic art is a natural part of my pedagogy, and it is an integral part of a student's education. I now have more concrete ways to integrate art into my classroom, and I am excited to inspire a whole new set of children.

### **A Trick to Making Kids Learn Soft Skills!**

Soft skills are often referred to as “people skills” or “non-cognitive skills” – essentially, the skills that are difficult to directly measure and the ones you can’t necessarily teach out of a book. These social skills for kids are vital for growth, development, and future employment opportunities. You taught your kids their ABC’s, how to remember their address and phone number, and how to ride a bicycle and now you have to teach them soft skills?! Before you tear your hair out, children learn a lot of soft skills by example. It’s easy to incorporate them into your daily life – in fact you may already do most of them. Do you find yourself saying: “Don’t slouch! Don’t gabble!” Kids tend to drop that ‘not’ out of everything – so instead of telling them what NOT to do, instead guide them towards what they should do: Stand tall. Speak clearly. Below are four prime examples that you and your child can get into the habit of doing that will help develop soft skills.

1. Encourage your children People require attention, but more importantly, they crave encouragement.
2. Demonstrate Social Skills Whether you teach your child how to properly shake someone’s hand or teach them to always say “please” and “thank you”, you’re teaching them social skills.
3. Acknowledge When They’re on Time If your child is awake, dressed, and has eaten before you had to tell them anything, make sure you praise them.
4. Talk About Scenarios in TV Shows and Movies Encourage your child to talk about what their favourite television or video game character did and tell you what they would have done differently. Visualizing different scenarios is also shown to increase creativity, openness, and more openness to risk or new situations. Teamwork, leadership, and communication are underpinned by soft skills development. Since each is an essential element for organizational and personal success, developing these skills are very important and does matter... a lot!



The interviewers of our school Press Club interviewed the principal and Rucha , student of Grade 10 and gained hands on experience.











## Introductory session






## NURTURE TOYCATHON

### Activity: Yellow day

The color of optimism and happiness. Yellow is a cheerful and energetic color that brings fun and joy to the world of learning, learning becomes easier as it affects the logical part of the brain, stimulating mentality and perception.

### Activity: Play dough


Play dough letters and numbers helps in word building, identification, alphabetical and numerical order. It also helps in hands on learning and developing fine motor skills.

I've often read and being told by people not to expect anything from anyone, be it a person or a book. And I've blindly followed the advice without realizing that sometimes, something can be much better and more amazing than you ever expected it to be.

Something similar happened between me and the book 'The Fault in Our Stars' by John Green. I have a bucket list of books I want to read and movies I want to watch while I am a teenager, because I'm sure I won't have as much fun after. This book had been lying in my school's library for a long time and I'd hoped to read it several times, but I always kept it back on the shelf knowing it was a love story and I wasn't ready for it, as the closest thing I had read to a love story was Harry Potter. But as soon as I turned 16 in the last month and papa said, "You could read a romantic novel for a change." I was surprised and unbelievably excited but sure that this genre would open endless exciting doors and I would thoroughly enjoy it.

Without a moment's thought, I knew I HAD to read 'The Fault in Our Stars' and asked papa to order it. I tried to start reading it the next day, but I just couldn't wait and ended up reading the first 3 chapters the day it was delivered.

There are two types of people in the world, a) Who have cried while watching a movie or a book where someone dies of cancer and b) LIARS! I thought this story would be like any other story about cancer. Girl meets boy; either of them is diagnosed with cancer; they decide to enjoy the time they have left together; either of them dies. But this book is not one of those sugarcoated stories that exist. It shakes you, wakes you up and pulls you to your real life rather than disguising itself as a fairy tale.


On the first page, we meet Hazel Grace Lancaster, a 17-year-old cancer patient who feels that her whole life is a side-effect of cancer. You might feel that her life must be so different from a regular teenagers' but guess what- it's exactly the same! Reality shows and books being her best friends. She meets Augustus Waters, an 18-year-old osteosarcoma survivor at a support group who turns her life upside down and makes her realize that 'her' story is different from her cancer story. I fell in love with both of them like you fall asleep, slowly, and then all at once! I remember frequently shutting the book and smiling to myself, reminiscing in so many of the book's iconic lines.

While I could relate to Hazel's character on so many levels from being a cranky teen frustrated with life, reading the same book over and over again and not wanting to prove anything to anyone; my favorite character was without a doubt, Augustus. His crooked smile, an unlit cigarette between his teeth and his fear of oblivion made me sketch an alive Augustus in front of my eyes who could solve my problems and keep me entertained. I got so involved and in fact entangled into the story that I never realized how quickly I finished reading it. I had tears in my eyes, not only because of the story but because these characters won't live with me anymore. But I couldn't have been more wrong, these characters are always going to stay with me, for a lifetime.

And now, *The Fault in Our Stars* has become my 'Imperial affliction' which teaches me that you can't get to choose if you get hurt in this world, but you do have some say in who hurts you.


